Ponderings

As we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord it provides the opportunity for us to reflect on the Sacrament of Baptism in our lives and the lives of others. I looked at some of the statistics that are relevant----and also for purposes of comparison. Consider the following:

--in 1970 there were 14.795 million baptisms in the Catholic Church worldwide

--in 2020 there were 12.723 million baptisms in the Catholic Church worldwide

--in 1970 there were 1.089 million baptisms in the United States

--in 2020 there were 545,710 million baptisms in the United States

The number of baptisms is going down in the United States and worldwide.

You might ask the question, ‘Why?’ One religion news writer has suggested the following reasons:

1. A rise in secularism. We live in an increasingly secular society. If some people are either ‘church-neutral’ or ‘anti-church’ then they are unlikely to bring their child to be baptized. One author says that among the nation’s 80 million ‘millennials’ (born between 1980 and 2000) only 15 percent call themselves ‘Christian’.
2. More interfaith marriages. The number of interfaith marriages continues to rise. The author says that some couples compromise by ditching specific faith rituals such as baptism to avoid contention.
3. Fewer ‘church marriages’. One author states that when a couple opts out of getting married in church, it’s an early sign that a couple may view the blessings of faith as optional for their family. In 1970 there were 426,000 marriages in U.S. Catholic churches---a full 20% of all U.S. marriages that year. By contrast, in 2011, there were 164,000 such weddings, only 8 % of all marriages. In both years Catholics were 23% of the population.
4. Misunderstandings. The author says the rising number of “out of wedlock” births may contribute to the decline in baptism. Single parents may be less apt to bring a child for baptism.

I do think there is some validity to each of these reasons. With that, I do know there are quite a few couples who have brought their babies to be baptized at St. Bernard. Some parents were not married in church. Some are from ‘inter-faith’ marriages and some are ‘single’ parents. It is all about giving the children the grace of the sacrament----so many helps and supports for each of them.

One catholic writer correctly states that many parents don’t understand the theology of baptism. He calls it the ‘most familiar but misunderstood sacrament’. He says it becomes a rite of passage for the family rather than what it really means---an incorporation into the Christian community. Some parents, for example, don’t realize that godparents should be Catholics or they are surprised when there is a ‘preparation class’ before the baptism.

I am always happy to provide for any parents a ‘short theology of baptism’ and speak to them about having their child baptized. So.....if you know of any young parents unsure about a baptism-----I’d be happy to speak to them.

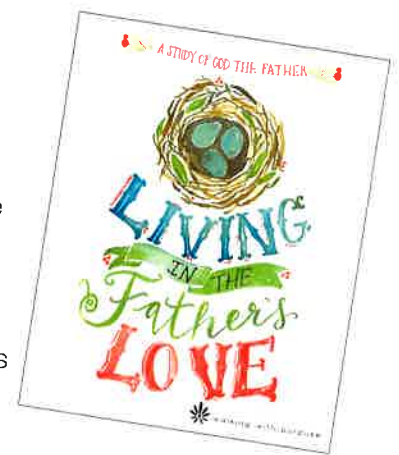
