Ponderings

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday. Jesus identifies himself as the Good Shepherd in today's Gospel. It is an appropriate time to reflect on the priesthood----since every priest tries to be the 'good shepherd' of the flock entrusted to him. I have three points for this Ponderings.

First Point: On April 11th at the Chrism Mass at the Cathedral of SS. Peter and Paul, Bishop Tobin asked the priests to renew their "Priestly Promises." Here is how the dialogue goes:

Bishop: Beloved sons, on the anniversary of that day when Christ our Lord conferred his priesthood on the Apostles and on us, are you resolved to renew, in the presence of your Bishop and God's holy people, the promises you once made?

Priests: I am.

Bishop: Are you resolved to be more united with the Lord Jesus and more closely conformed to him, denying yourselves and confirming those promises about sacred duties towards Christ's church which, prompted by love of him, you willingly and joyfully pledged on the day of your priestly ordination?

Priests: I am.

Bishop: Are you resolved to be faithful stewards of the mysteries of God in the Holy Eucharist and the other liturgical rites and to discharge faithfully the sacred office of teaching, following Christ the Head and Shepherd, not seeking any gain, but moved only by zeal for souls?

Priests: I am.

Second Point: On February 17th Pope Francis gave an address to the "International Theological Symposium on the Priesthood." It is a very fine talk addressed to priests. He speaks about "Four Forms of Closeness". They are: Closeness to God; Closeness to the Bishop; Closeness to other priests; Closeness to people. I think Pope Francis is right on target with all four! As a priest I try to maintain my prayer life---time to spend with God. As a priest I try to maintain a good relationship with the bishop. It was Bishop Mulvee who ordained me a deacon and priest. Bishop Tobin assigned me to St. Bernard's as pastor. If I go back in time, I received Confirmation when Bishop Gelineau was our bishop----although the bishop who confirmed me was Bishop Joyce, who was the retired bishop of Burlington, VT—Bishop Tobin invited him to our diocese to help with administering the sacrament of Confirmation. When I was baptized in 1960----Bishop McVinney was our bishop! The third form of closeness is be close to other priests. I have quite a few friends who are priests. Some are older than me, some are younger, and some are my age. We are a source of mutual support for each other. We understand 'the life' and 'the mission'. We often have the same "highs" and "lows"---successes and challenges. The fourth 'closeness' is to people. I look back on the various assignments I have had as a priest and in each case, there are people---'laymen and laywomen' with whom I have kept contact. I have always enjoyed my human interactions with parishioners.

Third Point: I recently saw the movie, "Father Stu". I liked it. You probably have heard the 'storyline'----it is about a man who was a boxer who led a 'rough and tumble' kind of life and one event after the other leads him back to practicing the faith, back to church and onto a path that leads him to the priesthood. It is a reminder that God can call his priests from any background. We see "Fr. Stu" with all his imperfections--called to serve God as priest. St. Paul would say that we hold 'this treasure' in an earthen vessel. An ordinary human being who carries in himself the spark of Christ----- a man configured to Christ through priestly ordination who desires to be a "Good Shepherd".

Each day I try to be the best Shepherd I can be to the parishioners of St. Bernard. I'm still working on it. It is often your faith, your hope and your love that inspire me to 'be the best I can be'----thank you for helping me to be the best Shepherd I can be.
