Ponderings

Pope Francis addressed the members of the Roman Curia with Christmas Greetings on December 21st. In this annual address he has had the tradition of speaking to them with some ‘challenging words’. This group is made up of mostly cardinals and bishops who are the directors and heads of various departments in the Vatican structure. In addition, our Holy Father issued his “Urbi et Orbi” message ---- translated as ‘to the city and to the world’ on December 25th (Christmas Day).

ADDRESS TO ROMAN CURIA

He writes, “The mystery of Christmas fills our hearts with awe---a key word—and an unexpected message: God has come, God is here in our midst, and his light has forever pierced the darkness of the world.” He then reflects on three words, ‘listen, discern and journey’. He writes, “First, there is Mary, who reminds us to listen.” Mary listens to the message of the angel and opened her heart to God’s plan. He continues, “Listening, in the Bible, refers to hearing not only with the ears, but also with the heart and one’s entire life.” He goes on to say, “Really listening to another person, however, requires interior quiet and making room for silence between what we hear and what we say.”

The pope speaks about discernment in the life of John the Baptist. Matthew’s Gospel says, “when John heard in prison about the deeds of the Christ, he sent word by his disciples and said to him, ‘Are you he who is to come, or shall we look for another?’ He says, “In a word, Jesus was not what people had expected, and even the Precursor (John the Baptist) had to be converted to the newness of the Kingdom. He had to have the humility and courage needed to discern.”

The third word he used was ‘journey’. He says, “Here we naturally think of the Magi. They remind us of the importance of journeying.” He continues, “He sends us on a journey, draws us out of our comfort zones, our complacency about what we have already done, and in this way he sets us free; he changes us and he enlightens the eyes of our heart to make us understand the great hope to which he has called us.”

What was especially striking to me in his address was the following: “Today we strive to kindle passion in those who have long since lost it. Sixty years after the Council, we are still debating the division between ‘progressives’ and ‘conservatives’, but that is not the difference: the real, central difference is between lovers and those who have lost that initial passion. That is the difference. Only those who love can fare forward.” In our faith lives we all run the risk of letting the ‘flame’ turn to ‘embers’----something fades, the energy, the passion, the strong connection----fades, diminishes, flattens in some way. I continue to love being a priest and serving as your pastor. I hope to do so for a few more years! How important it is for each of us to ‘fan into flame’ the embers of our faith. Perhaps the start of a new year will encourage us. Perhaps the celebration of our 150 years will inspire us.

URBI ET ORBI MESSAGE

The second text I draw your attention to is the pope’s annual, “Urbi et Orbi” message----to the city and to the world. He writes, “Brothers and sisters, today in Bethlehem, amid the deep shadows covering the land, an undying flame has been lighted. Today the world’s darkness has been overcome by the light of God, which ‘enlightens every man and woman.’ He continues, “Rejoice, you who have abandoned all hope, for God offers you his outstretched hand; he does not point a finger at you, but offers you his little baby hand, in order to set you free from your fears, to relieve you of your burdens and to show you that, in his eyes, you are more valuable than anything else.”

“Brothers and sisters, we are approaching the season of grace and hope that is the Jubilee, due to begin a year from now (2025). May this time of preparation for the Holy Year be an opportunity for the conversion of hearts, for the rejection of war and the embrace of peace, and for joyfully responding to the Lord’s call, in the words of Isaiah’s prophecy, “to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners.” ----have you thought of coming to Rome on our parish pilgrimage in May 2025?
