Ponderings

Installment #3 on Catholic Schools, “A Dozen Reasons to Choose Catholic Schools”! In my previous two columns I managed to get through #1-6. It has been a bit of a reflection on my experience in Catholic Schools as both a student and faculty member. So, bear with me!

#7 “We teach children respect of self and others.” How important is this!! Yes. As we reflect on our ‘school years’---especially middle school and high school, they were years when we came to understand our own ‘identity’---the question “Who am I?” is one that we all answer. At the core of that question there must be a respect for one’s dignity. As men and women of faith we believe that we always have that dignity in God’s eyes. That would be the motivation for a Catholic School to promote self-respect and respect of others. The “Golden Rule” was the unwritten rule in student handbooks. As a guidance counselor and campus minister I know that encouraging self-respect and respect of others was a key element of all we did!

#8 “We emphasize moral development and self-discipline.” One year I taught religious studies for juniors and the topic for one of the semesters was “Morality.” It was a very interesting course to teach. There were a number of Catholic principles that were conveyed---how to live a moral life---and there were many discussions about contemporary practice---about how to treat another person, dating, growing in virtue---and we looked at what society promoted or allowed---which was a ‘loose moral life’---students were bombarded with that message in advertisement; music; television programs; movies, etc.

#9 “We prepare students to be productive citizens and future leaders.” We want our Catholic School students to be good citizens. We, as Catholics, have a long history of good citizenship---we pay our taxes, we obey the laws, we vote, we serve in the military, we even run for public office. How important it is to encourage Catholics to bring their values into the ‘public square’---especially about the dignity of all human life. One of the first courses I taught (to freshmen) was a semester course in Civics. It was really an introduction to ‘Government.’ There is a great deal of media attention today about a lack of knowledge about civics. Maybe I should dust off my notes!

#10 “We have a 99 percent high school graduation rate. 85 percent of our graduates go to college.” I served as a guidance counselor/college advisor in three Catholic High Schools. I enjoyed that ministry. I did miss being in the classroom but helping young people in that the process of planning for ‘life after high school’---was a privilege---it was a way to help them discover “God’s plan” for them. I recall some of the advice from my own high school counselor (that, in itself should surprise you---remembering that far back!). He encouraged me to choose a vocation/job/career that would bring me happiness. He said there were far too many people ‘out there’ who really disliked or even hated their jobs. He conveyed the message that ‘a good job’ meant many things---including being a source of fulfillment and happiness.

#11 “We cultivate a faculty and staff of people who are dedicated, caring and effective.” In Catholic schools there is a goal---it takes time to achieve, to help the staff and faculty see their work as a ‘ministry.’ We wanted to convey to every teacher, not just the religion teacher, that they were promoting our ‘Catholic Identity’ by all they did in the classroom---what they taught, how they taught, how they interacted with students, etc.

#12 “We provide a safe and welcoming environment for all.” One of the great benefits of a school uniform---which just about every Catholic School has---uniform or dress code---is that it is ‘the great equalizer’---you do not know which student is from a poor family, a middle class family, a rich family---all receive the same treatment. Even with tuition costs that are getting to be quite high, Catholic Schools make great efforts to provide tuition assistance so that a catholic school education is possible for all families. It is a challenge, but through the generosity of alumni and benefactors there are endowments and funds that can be used for this purpose. My mother went to St. Xavier Academy, and she would tell us that the only reason she was able to go was that she was the second-to-youngest in the family and that her older brothers and sisters, now working, helped pay her tuition. I have come across so many families who make tremendous sacrifices to send their children to a Catholic School.
