## Ponderings

We continue to celebrate Easter! The Church provides a 'season' of Easter---a time to be renewed in faith, hope and love. Our Sunday Gospels during this season are about the resurrection appearances of Jesus. As he brought encouragement to his earliest disciples and followers, so, too, he brings that same encouragement to each of us. He leads us but also accompanies us, as he walked with those two disciples who were walking back to their village of Emaus.

In the last Ponderings I spoke about the "blessing of the oils" that takes place at the Chrism Mass during Holy Week. Bishop Henning blessed the large containers of oil that are then put in smaller bottles and given to each parish for use in the sacraments throughout the year. Last week I wrote about the "Oil of Catechumens".

One of the other oils----our subject this week, is the "Oil of the Sick". This is the oil that is used for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. In an earlier era this was called "Extreme Unction" or "Last Rites"-----there is now a fuller, expansive understanding of this sacrament----the anointing can take place not only at the 'very end of life'-----but whenever a person is sick----this broader understanding would include those who will undergo an operation, those who have a chronic health problem, those who are in declining health in a nursing home or in their own home. The prayer of anointing calls for 'strength'----and this can come to a person in body, mind and spirit.

Here is the prayer used at the Chrism Mass for the blessing of the 'Oil of the Sick'—"O God, father of all consolation, you willed to heal the infirmities of the weak through your Son, listen favorably to the prayer of faith: send forth from the heavens, we pray, your Holy Spirit, the Paraclete, upon this soil in all its richness, which you have graciously brought forth from the verdant tree to restore the body, so that by your holy blessing + everyone anointed with this oil as a safeguard for body, soul and spirit may be freed from all pain, all infirmity, and all sickness. May your holy oil, O Lord, be blessed by you for our sake in the name of Jesus Christ, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you forever and ever."

Throughout the Gospels we see Jesus bringing comfort and healing to the sick. To the blind, the lame, the lepers, the woman with the hemorrhages, the deaf, the mute, the man with the withered hand, those who were 'possessed by a demon'-----and so many others, Jesus brought new life, a restoration, a path forward, healing. It should not surprise us that the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick continues this ministry of Jesus.

There are times when this sacrament is administered when the person is 'by themselves'---- I have been called to the nursing home, for example, to anoint someone----and it often happens that they are in the room by themselves. At other times, family members have gathered at the bedside of the loved one and can participate---through their prayerful listening and responding. In the sacrament the sign of the cross is made (with the holy oil) on the person's forehead and on the palms of their hands.

Those who are anointed react in a variety of ways. I will say, however, that very often the administration of the sacrament brings a sense of peace to the person. Whenever we are battling an illness, the effects of surgery, aging-in general, in we can experience worry, fear and anxiety. It's natural for any of us. The sacrament reminds the person that Jesus is there to strengthen them, that the Holy Spirit remains with them, that they are the beloved son or daughter of the heavenly Father---who is aware of everything that happens to them.

Our parish is assigned Lakeside Rehabilitation Center (formerly South County Health and Rehabilitation). I celebrate Mass there once a month. We have a Eucharistic Minister who brings communion on Sunday mornings, and I am called by the staff if someone requests to be anointed. If you have any interest in being involved with this ministry to the sick, please let me know.

St. Joseph College and Prout High School were opened in response to the call for service in education and spiritual needs. Other invitations were responded to in CT, NY, MD and to far-flung needs in Jamaica, West Indies and Memphis Tennessee.
