Ponderings

Advent is upon us! At Mass we pray the following prayer after the Our Father: “Deliver us, Lord, from every evil, and grant us peace in our day. In your mercy, keep us free from sin and protect us from all anxiety, **as we wait in joyful hope** for the coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ.”

What does it mean to ‘wait in joyful hope’? I believe part of waiting is to experience silence. It seems that in our technological age we have less and less silence----or rather, there are many more distractions available----that we choose----think of our computers, tablets, phones----just for a start! We live in a world where there can be ‘noise’ around us 24 hours per day. Advent invites us to ‘waiting’ ----and how then can we embrace the silence we find in waiting? One spiritual writer has said, “At first silence might only frighten us. In silence we start hearing voices of darkness: our jealousy and anger, our resentment and desire for revenge, our lust and greed, and our pain over losses, abuses, and rejections. These voices are often noisy and boisterous. They may even deafen us. Our most spontaneous reaction is to run away from them and return to our entertainment.”

In the early 1960s, Dolores Hart stunned the Hollywood community when she left behind an acting career for the monastic life. She chronicled her story in The Ear of the Hart: An Actress' Journey from Hollywood to Holy Vows. She writes, “I have been a professed nun of the Abbey of Regina Laudis in Bethlehem, Connecticut, for over fifty years.” She continues, “But before I was a nun, I was an actress! As a professional actress---trained for both film and stage---I knew well the power of silence to communicate something beyond words. The memory of Dame Judith Anderson stealing a scene by simply standing in silence and stroking a cat comes to mind. Silence is far more than the absence of noise---it can be full of whatever is not being said, whatever is rumbling around in the heart. That is why silence cannot be imposed or legislated from without. Neither can it be achieved by an act of will. Silence springs from deep within the core of a person, as all primal human instincts and responses do. Silence, like love itself, grows in the hidden depths of the soul. Far from being in opposition to communication and exchange, real silence depends entirely on growth in relationship, both with God and with other people.”

Advent is a unique time to grow in our relationship with God. Where can we find the silence in a short period of time that can insert so many activities and tasks to be accomplished? Perhaps we need to be more intentional about giving ourselves to the silence----letting that ‘quiet time’ surface.

You will recall the passage in First Kings when Elijah is asked to go out and stand on the mountain for the Lord was about to pass by. Elijah was discouraged, frightened and upset because he had been doing the Lord’s work and he was the only one left. A great and powerful wind came by, but the Lord was not in that. An earthquake and fire came, but the Lord was not in those either. After the fire, a gentle whisper came and that was where Elijah heard the Lord speaking to him. Can I take time for the whisper of God in my life. Advent invites us to listen to the whisper. In silence we can hear the voice of God. Silence allows a connection to God beyond what words can express. Psalm 46:10 says, “Be still and know that I am God.”

The spiritual writer mentioned earlier speaks of ‘dark voices’----yes, we can sometimes hear these dark voices when we become quiet, when we await the whisper of God----but this author also tells us, “But if we have the discipline to stay put and not let these dark voices intimidate us, they will gradually lose their strength and recede into the background, creating space for the softer, gentler voices of the light. These voices speak of peace, kindness, gentleness, goodness, joy, hope, forgiveness and most of all, love.” He continues, “They (these voices) have been speaking to us since before we were born, and they reveal to us that there is no darkness in the One who sent us into the world, only light. They are part of God’s voice calling us from all eternity: ‘My beloved child, my favorite one, my joy.’”

Let us wait in joyful hope.....
