Ponderings

This past weekend we had the annual “Retirement Fund for Religious” collection. This collection, established in 1988 by the Catholic bishops of the United States is meant to address the significant lack of retirement funding for Catholic sisters, brothers and priests in religious orders. For most of their lives the elderly religious worked for little or no pay. In their younger years there were no 401K plans or pensions. Religious communities are financially responsible for the support and care of their members. Income, earnings and expenses are managed separately from the parish and diocesan structures of the Catholic Church.

Only 6 percent of the religious communities providing data to the National Religious Retirement

Office are adequately funded for retirement: 42% have twenty-five or fewer members. Many small communities struggle to care for elder members due to a lack of financial resources and personnel. Today, religious past the age of 70 outnumber religious younger than 70 by nearly three to one. There are 24,005 religious past the age of 70 living in the United States. In 2022, the average annual cost for their care was roughly \$55,500 per person; skilled nursing care averaged \$83,700 per person. Since 2009, the annual cost to support senior women and men religious has exceeded \$1 billion dollars. In 2022, 71% of the religious communities providing data to the National Religious Retirement Office had a median age of 70 or higher. The average annual Social Security benefit for a religious is \$7,679, whereas the average lay US beneficiary receives \$21,902.

How does the annual collection help? Each year, hundreds of US religious communities receive financial assistance made possible by the Retirement Fund for Religious. Communities can use this funding for immediate retirement expenses or invest it for future needs. Since the first collection US Catholics have donated more than \$975 million. Since the collection began, almost \$843 million has been distributed to support the day-to-day care of elderly sisters, brothers and religious order priests. An additional \$102.6 million has been allocated toward self-help projects initiated by religious communities, including collaborative health-care facilities. In addition to direct financial assistance, proceeds from the annual collection underwrite educational programming services and resources that enable religious communities to evaluate and prepare for long term retirement needs.

In the Diocese of Providence, last year—2022, parishioners contributed \$169,748.63 to the collection. This money is pooled with the collections from all other dioceses in the United States. Disbursement of the financial assistance depends on the number of elderly in the particular religious community. For example, the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary received a total of \$297,718.38 in financial support made possible by the Retirement Fund for Religious. Note, that they actually received more than was collected in the diocese----due to the ‘pooling of contributions’ from around the country. There are parts of the country, particular dioceses where there is a greater concentration of elderly religious. In addition to the Franciscan Missionaries of Mary, the Sisters of Mercy, the DeLaSalle Christian Brothers and our ‘local Sisters of the Cross and Passion’ would have a considerable number of elderly members.

We know that these religious men and women have selflessly served for decades without significant financial compensation. They are now facing escalating health care costs. The national collection in 2022 yielded \$27.6 million. Financial assistance was provided for the retirement needs of 297 US religious communities.

Sadly, with so many religious communities, there are very few new vocations. Some religious orders do have new members joining. In years past, the ‘new vocations----new sisters, brothers and religious order priests’ were there to earn an income and help provide for the senior members of the community. With fewer and fewer vocations---new members---that source of financial assistance was no longer available.

Pray for our elderly religious----in gratitude for their lifetime of service. Pray for vocations to the religious life. Thank you for your generosity in supporting this collection.


Landscape Improvement
